Please note, clubs will begin on the week of 15th January. Half term is the week of 12th February. The last week of clubs will be the week of 11th March (leaving the remaining week of term free in the event of catch-up clubs). The prices are based on 8 weeks of clubs (except Tuesday and Thursday after school clubs, which will be based on 7 weeks due to progress evenings). 


