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## TOUCH-TYPING

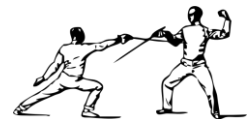

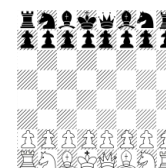

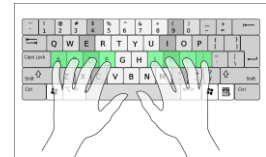

The children will need to read (or listen to) the six books during the course of the Christmas holidays and Spring Term, so that they arrive ready and willing to share their ideas at each Literature Circle meeting. We will also provide a reading journal and post-it notes for the children to record their thoughts and mark key pages as they read the books.

**To ensure that we have the books available before the end of the Autumn Term, we will need parents to sign their child up for the Club by 7pm on the 24th November via Schools Buddy.**

We will purchase the books for your child and all books will be given to the children before the end of the Autumn Term.
